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REPORT WITH OUTCOMES OF THE 28TH NATIONAL INTEGRATION & YOUTH LEADERSHIP CAMP

The National Integration and Youth Leadership Camp is a program that main aim is to foster unity, patriotism, and leadership by exposing youth to India's diverse cultures, reducing regional/religious differences, and promoting a shared national identity, all while developing skills for positive nation-building. **The National Integration & Youth Leadership Camp is organized by the Central Calcutta Science and Culture Organization for Youth**, a social, Voluntary and philanthropic organisation helped to create empowered, aware, and united young citizens who can serve as catalysts for peace, harmony, and development in their communities and the nation. The goals of the camps are: -

- To shape up the youth of our country in terms of education, Strength and overall well-being for the development of the country and inculcate in them the spirit of unity and integrity through a variety of development programmes of the youth, such as, National Integration Camps, Science Awareness Campaigns, etc.
 - To impact awareness multi-disciplinary subjects including prevailing Science & Technology, Electronics & Information Technology, environment & Forests, Earth Science, Bio-technology, Space Science etc.
 - To rouse Awareness about the Tourism & Cultural Heritage of our country.
 - To lend a helping hand to poor meritorious students, youth and the aged, sick and helpless.
 - To foster the pursuit of Literacy, Scientific and Technical Education.
 - To promote Scientific and cultural projects of the Central and State Government.
 - To observe the birthdays of the great personalities and popularize their among the masses and also observe the Republic and Independence Day to generate the spirit of nationalism.
 - To arrange for lectures, workshops, seminars, exhibitions etc. at National Level relating to Science & culture and publish papers, Bulletins magazines etc.
 - To offer trainings on Self-development.
- The camp offers a platform to promotes unity in diversity and peaceful coexistence. Encourages respect and equal value for all citizens.

The 28th National Integration and Youth Leadership Camp commenced successfully on 26th December 2025 at Muktamancha, Assam University, Silchar, in cooperation with the Government of Assam and the North Eastern Council. The camp has been organised with the aim of promoting national unity, leadership skills, discipline, and cultural harmony among the youth of the nation. A more than 578 college students participated in the camp, comprising 210 residential students from different states of India and 368 non-residential college students from institutions. The inaugural day marked a vibrant and inspiring beginning to this national-level programme, bringing together young minds from diverse cultural, social, and educational backgrounds.

The 28th National Integration & Youth Leadership Camp is organised in cooperation with North Eastern Council, Government of India, Government of Assam. The North Eastern Council funded this national integration & youth leadership camp. The financial support of Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakhs only) was sanctioned by the North Eastern Council, Government of India for holding this national camp.



Inaugural Ceremony

The inaugural programme began with an assembly of dignitaries, participants, and organisers. The ceremony reflected a

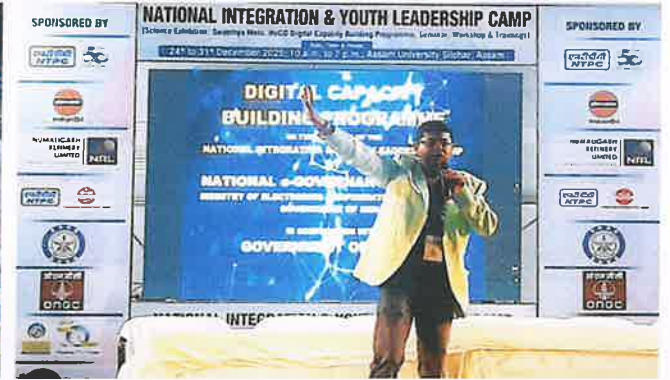

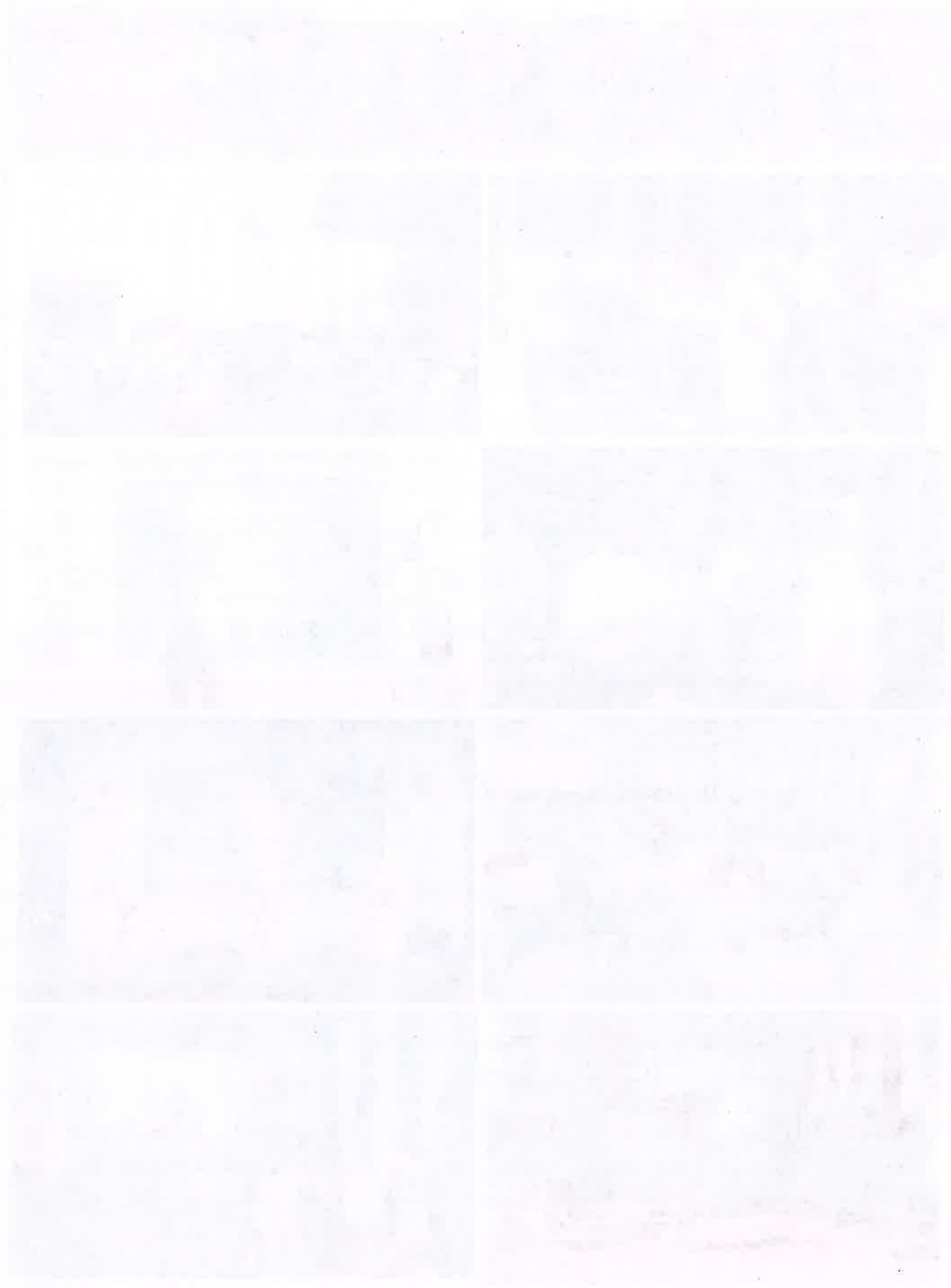
